PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES

The Little Silver Board of Education is committed to creating a 21st century learning environment to provide equitable access to technology that will aid our students in becoming self-directed learners, collaborative team players, and information producers as well as information consumers. Providing students and staff with a 21st century digital learning environment is essential to the district mission to promote student achievement in the New Jersey Student Learning Standards.

Student use of privately-owned electronic devices in the educational program during the school day is not permitted. Students will use their district issued device to complete work related to their curriculum.

Personal electronic devices may not be used at any time. Students are prohibited from recording or videotaping other students and/or staff members without their permission.

Students and staff are required to access the district's wireless network when using the approved, district issued, devices during the school day under the supervision of the classroom teacher. The use of private network access on school grounds is prohibited. Users may not disable, override or circumvent district technology filters and protection measures.
